Tim Gaskin called the meeting to order at 6:00PM.

1. Approval of Minutes:

Randy Amadon made a motion to approve the March 31, 2014 minutes. Oralie Lefaiivre seconded, and the motion carried 3-0-2 with Ron Aiken and Ray Durocher being the two abstentions.

Oralie Lefaiivre made a motion to approve the April 28, 2014 minutes. Randy Amadon seconded, and the motion carried 4-0-1 with Tim Gaskin abstaining.

2. Approval And Signing of Orders:

The Board approved and signed the orders for weeks 19 & 20.

3. Bandstand Park Request:

Ray Durocher made a motion to allow the Lyndon Bible Church to use Bandstand Park on Saturday, August 16, 2014 for their Pennies in the Park event. Randy Amadon seconded, and the motion carried 5-0.

4. Water Rates and Fees Schedule:

The Trustees signed the Water Rates and Fees schedule that became effective on February 4, 2014.

5. Water Connection Applications:

Tim Gaskin made a motion to approve the Water Connection Application for William Hood at 2385 Lily Pond Road. Ray Durocher seconded, and the motion carried 5-0.

Ron Aiken made a motion to approve the Water Connection Application for Charles Williamson at 405 South Wheelock Road. Randy Amadon seconded, and the motion carried 5-0.

6. Elm Street striping for parallel parking:

The Trustees told Justin Smith that it was okay for the Village crew to proceed with painting the parking spots along Elm Street as parallel parking spaces as was previously discussed.

7. Downtown Flowers:

Justin Smith updated the Trustees on the flowers and planters for downtown. It was agreed that the Village crew would pick the worst seven locations on Depot Street and replace the dying trees with planters filled with flowers. The Chamber of Commerce has already provided a \$400.00 contribution and the Rotary Club is expected to contribute a similar amount. The Trustees will revisit the issue in the Fall once it can be determined how well the planters worked.

8. Other:

Several Trustees expressed concern regarding the H.O.P.E. Color Vibe Event starting its music at 6:45 am in the Park.

Oralie Lefavre expressed concern regarding the intersection of Back Center Road and Center Street. She noted the line striping for the stop bars was completely wore away on the roads.

Tim Gaskin asked if the Village Crew could repair the bank on lower Charles Street which has begun to erode.

It was also noted that vehicles were parking directly in front of the hydrant at Ken Burchesky's house on Main Street.

The meeting was turned over to Ken Mason at 6:16 PM.
